Jubilee Meadow Makers Working Group update



Below are notes of an informal meeting of the working group from 1st March. Subsequent to the meeting the following should be noted:

- The fortnightly working sessions on the meadow are continuing and we've built a small but regular team
- A willow 'living wigwam' has been created beside the soakaway along with a willow fence in front of the water tank
- A new interpretation board focusing on grassland regeneration and the use of green-hay that is being provided by The Norfolk RiversTrust is on order
- Ragwort forks and a soil rake have been purchased from project funds. We are intending to buy clip-frames for poster display
- Initial contacts have been made with the primary school
- Swift project most of the home-owners of the existing Swift colony on Long Lane have been approached and there was a very positive response to the proposal to put up Swift boxes on their properties. Funding opportunities notably a SNDC Go-for-It grant are being explored
